

Driving cab was a somewhat controversial occupation for a woman when I shot this photo for an article in 1969.




East Hastings Street, Fall 1970. Happiness was a consignment store for local craftspeople run by Roger Brewton, who helped found the Vancouver Free University.






Protesters march down Robson Street on their way to St. Paul's Hospital, part of an abortion rights rally, May 1970.






